Yours of June 7th. came on time, but as I had so much to do I just had to pile up lots of letters until I could find time to write. Hope you will understand and not think that I am just careless, hope I can keep nearer or up now.

We have not bought any machinery, and probably will not for a month or two yet, - can't say how much we will buy, that depends somewhat on the condition of things and the out look at the time we place our order, but we may only buy a few thousand spindles at first. We are only building a house for fifteen thousand spindles, and looms, and we may only put in part of that amount at first. WE will commence laying brick in the walls next Monday, have our foundations and lot of other rock work done. It looks now as if it will take us the balance of the year to get our house done, but cant tell now. We have not decided definitely what we will make yet, but will in a short time, will be glad of any suggestions you might see fit to make, no doubt you will see things as you go along that will help us, shall be glad to hear from you at any time.
